The Sights of Geography

Santa Fe Trail High School students are finding that geography is more than just lines on a map. SFTHS social studies instructor Bob Hug informs students that geography is not just the measuring and drawing of land on paper, but the way human beings use space, distance, maps and the cultural practices of the people of the world.

A great way to start out the year in Geography is to have students do research of countries of the world and develop presentations. In Mr. Hug's Geography classes, students have been actively researching and learning about the different countries of Europe. Their research has been followed up by oral presentations to their classmates.

Throughout the semester, students taking the SFT Geography class will be examining current issues that impact our world today, They will also acquire an understanding of the development of human systems, human understanding of the world, and human social organization. The more traditional method of teaching students to develop geographic skills, such as learning to interpret maps, analyze data, and compare theories will help students' understanding of the development of modern civilization.

Santa Fe Trail High School Offers Tests Prep Courses to Assist Students with College Entrance Tests

ACT This course provides students with the opportunity to prepare to successfully complete the ACT college entrance exam. On-screen teachers present the exam with an overview of the test and its content as well as proven test-taking strategies. Practice tests modeled after the ACT exams are used to diagnose and target areas of opportunity. Students are prescribed individualized paths of study and provided instructional content for review inc luding video-based instruction by high-qualified teachers, interactive assignments, and regular assessment opportunities to track progress. Recommended for students attending a four year college or university.

Compass This course reviews the concepts and skills essential for college readiness as measured by the Compass post-secondary placement exam. SFTHS students enrolling in ACC courses must have a qualifying Compass score if they do not qualify with the written Asset test. In this course students will complete a diagnostic pre-test that assesses specific areas of strength and weakness. Based on the assessment results the students receive a personalized learning plan providing the most efficient and effective preparation possible. Recommended for students attending a two year college.
