CONFERENCES

Santa Fe Trail High School personnel are in the last stages of conferencing with parents and students of all 9th, 10, and 11th graders. For the Class of 2015, 95% of 84 conferences have been completed by the two counselors—Melissa Strother and Joy Schmidt. For the Class of 2016, 91% of 75 conferences and for the Class of 2015, 95% of 75 conferences were completed by the two counselors, Patrick Graham, Marci Alstatt, Tina McIver, David Swaim, Steve Pegram and Shellie Robinson.

GREEN TEAM

In an effort to inform the community of the energy efficiency of new CFL and LED light bulbs, the newly formed SFT GREEN TEAM partnering with Batteries Plus of Topeka, shared their knowledge of how families can cut cost in their utility bills and help improve the environment at the same time. The students set up a booth at two home basketball games and visited with patrons sharing what they had learned about the use of electricity in our homes. The Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007 requires that new light bulbs be 25-30% more energy efficient. Not only will the new bulbs use less energy they will also last much longer. While these new energy efficient bulbs are more expensive initially, the savings will be noticed in the electric bill each month with the typical household saving between \$50 and \$100 per year. In an effort to offset these costs Batteries Plus has graciously donated coupons to ease the burden of making the transition.

A few of the facts GREEN TEAM members shared with interested individuals:

• 90% of the energy coming into a traditional incandescent bulb is turned into heat, not light

- 6% of the average electric bill is spent on lighting your home
- If every home in America replaced one incandescent light bulb with a CFL it would save enough energy to light 3 million homes for a year and remove 9 BILLION pounds of greenhouse emissions per year from the atmosphere. Imagine what would happen if we replaced them with LED's.

YEARBOOK AWARDS

This year the Chargers finished 15-7, and will return 13 wrestlers with varsity experience. The Chargers lose two seniors, Trent Padgett, and Gayle Warren, from a team of 23. SFT had three freshman qualify for the state tournament in Chris Davis at 106, Bryce Erickson at 113, and Jacob Hastings at 285.
