Education Bills Recommended by Committees, Feb. 24

Here is a list of education-related bills that have been recommended by committees and could be debated by the full House and Senate this week. None are scheduled for debate today.

On House General Orders

<u>HB 2095</u> - Issuing \$1.5 billion of pension obligation bonds to finance a portion of the unfunded actuarial liability of KPERS.

<u>HB 2185</u> - School buildings must be available as polling places with 365 day notice; teacher inservice days optional. <u>KASB opponent</u> (*committee amendments addressed some of KASB's objections*).

<u>HCR 5004</u> - Constitutional amendment; providing for direct partisan election of supreme court justices and court of appeals judges; abolishing the supreme court nominating commission. <u>KASB opponent.</u>

<u>HCR 5005</u> - Constitutional amendment allowing the governor to appoint supreme court justices and court of appeals judges, subject to Senate confirmation; abolishing the supreme court nominating commission. <u>KASB opponent.</u>

<u>HB 2163</u> - Municipalities; contracts with other municipalities (including school districts) for services. <u>KASB proponent.</u>

<u>HB 2170</u> - Grades K-12; use of seclusion and restraint of students with disabilities. <u>KASB</u> <u>neutral.</u> (On original bill; new bill addresses many concerns; KASB seeking further input to improve the bill.)

<u>HB 2031</u> - School district plan addressing child sexual abuse; establishing Erin's law.

<u>HB 2174</u> - Tax credit for low income students scholarship program act amendments. <u>KASB</u> opponent.

<u>HB 2199</u> - School districts human sexuality education; policies and procedures; requires "opt in." <u>KASB opponent.</u>

<u>HB 2267</u> - Alternative project delivery; notice requirements and selection procedures.

<u>HB 2326</u> - Contract negotiations for certain professional employees; removes exclusive bargain. <u>KASB opponent.</u> <u>HB 2034</u> - Reduces negotiable terms and conditions in the professional negotiations act; not agreed-upon changes proposed by KASB, KNEA, USA and KSSA. *KASB opponent*.

On Senate General Orders

- <u>SB 27</u> Increases filing exemption amount for school board and other local candidates.
- <u>SB 32</u> Requiring school district and Kansas State Department of Education Audits; creating the Efficient Operation of Schools Task Force; amended to require audits in six districts in 2016-17, 50 percent of cost paid by districts. <u>KASB proponent</u>.
- <u>SB 60</u> Requires participation by home schooled students in activities regulated by the Kansas State High School Activities Association; subject to certain requirements.
- <u>SB 168</u> Issuing \$1 billion of pension obligation bonds to finance a portion of the unfunded actuarial liability of KPERS.
- <u>SB 70</u> Requires fingerprint background checks for teachers; other school employees with direct contract with students.
- <u>SB 171</u> School board and municipal elections; spring to fall of odd-numbered years; non-partisan voting; requires schools to be used for polling places upon 90 day notice from county election officer. <u>KASB opponent.</u> (*Committee amendments address some objections.*)
- <u>SB 188</u> Specifies certain compensation and school board expenditure information in district budget documents; specifies how budget documents must be displayed with links on district websites; financial penalties for non-compliance.
