Stuff the Turkey

After the assembly, cinnamon rolls and coffee were served in OAC's cafeteria. We had over 100 veterans attend.

We have had our first successful delivery from Harvesters. Harvesters' mission is to feed hungry people today and work to end hunger tomorrow. They are a regional food bank serving a 26 county area of northwestern Missouri and northeastern Kansas. Harvesters provides food and related household products to more than 620 not-for-profit agencies including emergency food pantries, community kitchens, homeless shelters, children's homes and others.

We are currently sending home 60 packets of food each Friday with children in need.
