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## Lexia Super Stars!

You may be aware that the district has implemented a new reading

resource this year to complement Lead 21. At the beginning of September, all students took the Lexia placement test and have been up and running full steam ahead. Lexia focuses on phonetic awareness, phonics, structural analysis, automaticity/fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. Students earn certificates for each level completed. To pass a level, the student must successfully complete various units comprised of lessons focused on the areas mentioned above. Lexia targets the skills identified for students in grades preK- five. Currently we have three fourth grade students who have completed the program, eleven fourth graders working at fifth grade level, and four third grade students now working at fourth grade level. We are super excited about the success students are experiencing.
