The Industrial Education Department to compete at 2016 Ku Engineering Expo

Have you ever heard of a Trebuchet? "The trebuchet is a <u>compound machine</u>—a combination of <u>simple machines</u>. The trebuchet makes use of the <u>mechanical advantage</u> of a <u>lever</u>. Most trebuchets are powered exclusively by the <u>force</u> of <u>gravity</u>. <u>Potential energy</u> is stored by means of an extremely heavy weight box attached (by a <u>hinged</u> connection) to the counterweight portion of the throwing arm."
