
NHS AND DR. SEUSS

GREEN TEAMThe Green Team at SFT purchased a new rock for landscaping at SFT.





On February 26, 2016, Mr. Stanton's Industrial Engineering/Education took two teams from Santa Fe Trail to participate in the Engineering Expo competition at Kansas University. The first team, The Thundertakers Attack Squad, which consisted of Candace Roberts, Ian Trego, and Seth Coltrane. The second team, The Lightning Bolt Strikes consisted of Herschel Cress, Jordan Massy, and Calvin Young. Both teams had designed different trebuchets.

First order of business was to sign in and listen to the key note speaker Albert Dirkzwager. He is the director/CEO of Aircraft Systems Engineering for Textron Aviation in Wichita, Kansas. He is responsible system integration of new aircraft models and support systems aspects of fielded and production aircraft. It is clear to see that Wichita is a major aerospace engineering hub for the United States. He also indicated that there is an engineering shortage in this country and many jobs are filled with candidates outside of the United States.



The trebuchet competition took place in Learned Engineering hall in room 3151. The entire building was filled with engineering events and challenges going on throughout the day. Thunder takers Attack Squad took three shots at the target and received 65/100 point for hitting the bullseye and for having an outstanding design. Then Lightning Bolt Strikes received 85/100 points for hitting the bullseye twice and having the theme incorporated. We watched everyone else finish and felt very confident with our trebuchets. The event turned out to be an outstanding event with the one team getting third place medals and the other team coming in 4th out of 25 competitors. **Way to go Charger Engineers!**

After the competition, we watched other events like the Free Floating Gliders, Robotic Soccer, Formula Race Car construction, Chemical and gravity cars and many more events. Overall, it was an amazing experience and look forward to seeing another team there next year.

and Jake Hastings. It was again one of the overall toughest state tournaments in many years according to Coach Erickson. Santa Fe Trail had 4 medalists when all was settled on Saturday: senior Ethan Dean placed 4th at 195 pounds, junior Jake Hastings placed 6th at 285 pounds, Christian Davis place 4th at 106 pounds, and junior Bryce Erickson placed 3rd at 132 pounds.
