The office referrals increased this nine weeks, this is not uncommon for the time of the year, but I am still not happy with the high number. My hope is positive office referrals will help encourage good behavior. The ISS numbers are also higher, but a majority of the ISS are for the same special education student.

**Body Venture-** Last month Body Venture came to OAC. Body Venture is about learning how to eat smart and play hard. It is a great opportunity for students to learn about the importance of making healthy food choices and being physically active. The exciting tour is of the human body featuring engaging, experiential educational activities. The students really enjoy the tour and we had a lot of volunteers help to make the tour successful.

**Physical Education Position-** We had 21 applicants for the physical education position. Betsy Kraus, Kayla Chiddix and I interviewed six candidates for the position. It was a very difficult decision but I feel we recommended the best candidate to be hired.

**Open Elementary Positon-** Sandy Woodruff has asked to move to third grade, and with this movement, OAC has two open first grade positions. We interviewed four candidates for the positions on March 2<sup>nd</sup>. By the time of the board meeting, I plan to have two names to recommend to be hired.
