ASSEST TEST

On Thursday, April 28, Allen County College will be coming to SFT to administer the Assest Test for the students wishing to enroll in ACC class for the 2016-17 school year. The Assest Test is a timed paper/pencil test that is similar to the traditional ACT Test.

SPORTS PHYSICALS FOR 2016-17

In conjunction with Washburn University School of Nursing, the Santa Fe Trail school district will provide the opportunity for student athletes to receive a sports physical at school. These physicals will be valid through the 2016-2017 school year. Nurse Practitioners and Nurse Practitioner students will provide the physicals under the direction of a physician. Physicals will be offered to athletes in grades 6-11 on May 4th from 8:30 to 11:30 am at Carbondale Attendance Center and from 12:30 to 3:30 pm at Santa Fe Trail High School. Participation in this program does not guarantee that your student will be cleared for participation in sports. If your student has a pre-existing medical condition, it is recommended that you have your personal physician perform the exam. The cost of the physical is \$35 payable to St. Francis Health Center. Cash or checks will be accepted. Insurance will not be billed. Parents must sign a written consent form and complete and sign the parent/student portion of the sports physical form. Blank forms may be obtained from the school health office. The physical form may be downloaded from the Kansas State High School Athletic Association at http://www.kshsaa.org/Public/PDF/FORM-PPE.
