Wrestling

The Chargers began their season on Thursday, December 1st with a win over Eudora. The team didn't get much rest as they traveled to Spring Hill for a very tough dual tournament on Friday, December 2nd. The Spring Hill dual tournament is a big school vs. small school format. SFT went 4-1 on the day as they beat Olathe South, Shawnee Mission South, Desoto, and Blue Valley. Their only loss on the day was to Olathe Northwest. There are 32 wrestlers and 3 managers on the team this year. Santa Fe Trail will host a Junior Varsity Tournament on Friday, December 9th and then head to Anderson County for a Varsity Tournament on Saturday, December 10th. December is a busy month for the Charger Wrestlers but Coach Erickson and the team are excited about the season. Santa Fe Trail will be a 2017 Class 4A Regional Wrestling site on February 17th and 18th. We are excited to host this event and will have 14 other schools in attendance.

Basketball

The SFT boys' team has 30 members out this season, plus 4 managers and the girls' team consists of 20 players and 3 managers. On Monday, December 5th the Chargers opened up the season with 3 teams in action. The "C" girls beat Osage City, and the varsity teams both beat West Franklin in the Ike Cearfoss – Central Heights Tournament, an early season tournament. Due to limited space at Central Heights, Santa Fe Trail is hosting 2 rounds of the tournament. Each team will open the regular season at home on Tuesday, December 13th against Prairie View. The boys and the girls will both have freshmen, junior varsity and varsity teams this year. Games are normally played on Tuesdays and Fridays. When the teams are at home, games are played at Santa Fe Trail High School main and auxiliary gyms. Santa Fe Trail will be a 2017 Class 4A DII Sub-State Basketball site. The games will be played on Thursday, March 2nd (Boys), Friday, March 3rd (Girls), and the championships will be on Saturday, March 4th. The other schools in our Sub-State are: Prairie View, Osawatomie, and Hayden.
