A Cultural Exchange based on everyone's favorite subject-FOOD!



### Athletics and Activities at Santa Fe Trail High School

Basketball, Wrestling, Scholars Bowl, and Forensics continue to be in full swing for this winter season. With that said, the spring sports season is just around the corner with practices starting on Monday, February 27<sup>th</sup>. Be sure your student athlete has their physical, district activity form and concussion form completed and turned in. They must also have completed an on-line concussion education program (more information below). There will be a High School Spring Sports Parent Meeting on Monday, February 27<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm in the high school gym.

### Basketball

The Santa Fe Trail boys and girls basketball teams have had a tough slate of action this season. During the week of January 16<sup>th</sup> both teams participated in the Royal Valley Tournament where the girls went 0-3 and the boys went 1-2. Senior night will be held on Tuesday, February 14<sup>th</sup> when we host Burlington. SFTHS will host a basketball sub-state on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup>. Boys games will be on Thursday and girl's games on Friday. The

championships will be played on Saturday. The first game of each night will begin at 6:00 pm. The winners will then advance to state to be held at Lee Arena in Emporia the next week.

## Wrestling

Santa Fe Trail will host the Pioneer League wrestling tournament on Thursday, February 9<sup>th</sup> starting at 3:00 pm. Santa Fe Trail will then host Regionals on February 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>. Those wrestlers who place 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> at Regionals will then go on to state competition at the Bicentennial Center in Salina on February 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>. SFT wrestlers who are currently ranked in Class 4A are: Aaron Buterakos – 6<sup>th</sup> at 106, Christian Davis – 3<sup>rd</sup> at 113, Bryce Erickson – 2<sup>nd</sup> at 145, Evan Dean – 6<sup>th</sup> at 220, and Jake Hastings – 5<sup>th</sup> at 285. As a team Santa Fe Trail is ranked #8 in Class 4A.

# **Dual Sport Participation**

There has been some interest from students who would like to participate in 2 sports during the spring season. Below is the Board policy on this issue:

Students may participate in two sports during one season, with approval from the coaches of both sports. In addition, a parent meeting with the coaches and athlete will occur prior to the season beginning. Next, two sport athletes are expected to begin their dual sports on the same day. If they do not, the days missed will be considered to be unexcused. After two unexcused absences from one sport, they will no longer be able to participate in both sports.

#### **Scholars Bowl**

Our Scholars Bowl team will travel to Wamego on Thursday, February 2<sup>nd</sup> for Regional action. State Scholars Bowl will be held on Saturday, February 11<sup>th</sup>.

### **Forensics**

The Forensics Squad got off to a great start to the 2017 season with a 2<sup>nd</sup> place team finish at the McClouth Invitational on Saturday, January 28<sup>th</sup>. This Saturday, they will travel to Rossville.

#### **Concussion Program**

Santa Fe Trail High School students who are planning to participate in sports/cheer/dance anytime during the 2016-2017 school year are required to attend a free Concussion In Sports on-line course prior to starting practices. Those students who are participating in spring sports will be required to have this process completed prior to the start of practice on Monday, February 27<sup>th</sup>. Those that have not completed this requirement by that time, will not be allowed to practice until they have it completed. This is a requirement by the Kansas State High School Activities Association Executive Board. Anyone can participate in these courses and many others offered by NFHS by going to NFHSLearn.com. Once completed, you can either print off your certificate or take a photo of it for proof of completion. Again, this is a requirement for any student who plans to participate in sports/cheer/dance during the 2016-2017 school year.
