It is hard to believe that we have completed the first semester of the year and are well into the second. Boys' basketball is in full swing and our student clubs, KAY and FBLA, have been active as well. The CAC staff has been flexible, making adjustments due to the extra days off and our janitors have worked very hard battling the snow and ice to keep everyone safe.

Behaviors: Throughout the month of January four students were issued in-school suspensions and 15 served lunch or afterschool detentions.

We have some teachers and classes participating in the Great Kindness Challenge taking place January 28-February 1st. Simple things such as giving a kind smile and slipping a complement to others can make a huge difference in the life of others and require little effort on our part.

Sports: The boys' basketball teams have completed the first half of their season. The 7th-grade teams have had more wins than losses. The 8th-grade and Instructional teams have played hard but have not achieved as many wins. The season will wrap-up on February 21st at home against Iola. Track practice will begin at the end of the month!

Scholars Bowl: Both 7th and 8th-grade students have begun practicing once or twice a week during Charger Time for the scholars bowl events. Their first competition will be in Burlington on February 19th.

The kids participated in several break-out sessions and brought home numerous ideas for they hope to implement at CAC. KAY students have also provided helping hands during Grandparent/VIP Days guiding guests to the appropriate classrooms. They are also gearing up for the Valentine sucker sales which will take place February 11-14th. Profits will help offset the expenses for KAY members to attend the Kansas Leadership Camp this summer.
