# Athletics and Activities at Santa Fe Trail High School

#### Football

Currently, the Varsity Chargers are 2-2 on the season and in one of the toughest 3A Districts in the state. After a 36-6 loss to Hayden last Friday, we are 0-1 in districts. The Chargers will travel to Perry-Lecompton for their 2<sup>nd</sup> district game of 2019. The top 4 in districts will advance to a bracket game. If we finish 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> in our district, we will be playing the 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> place team out of another district to ensure that the varsity team gets 9 games in. The Junior Varsity is 3-1 and the Freshman / C Team is 1-1.

### **Volleyball**

As of October 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Santa Fe Trail Charger varsity volleyball team is 2-4 in league, and 7-13 overall. The varsity team will travel to Wellsville this weekend for a regular season tournament and the JV team, which has a 9-8-1 record, will head to Jefferson West for a tournament. The freshmen travel to Perry-Lecompton next weekend for their final tournament. Their current record is 0-16. Santa Fe Trail hosted Burlington and Wellsville this past Tuesday night.
