2020 CONTINUES TO KEEP US ON OUR TOES

SFTHS has made a few modifications to meet the demands of 2020 and COVID 19. Here are a few of them:

1. Temperature checks as you enter the building.

2. Face masks are required.

3. Breakfast/Lunch is served "old school." Our lunch staff will be serving out of the kitchen like they did in the 90's.

4. The commons area has a ton of tables spread out from end to end with not many chairs at each table.

5. When you enter the school in the morning, you may stop by your locker but will need to then report to the main gym or to the commons area to eat breakfast. Social distancing must occur.

6. The blue benches on the carpet and throughout the building have been put away.7. Any extra furniture in classrooms has been removed.

8. The school day schedule is going to keep you on your toes this year. We are going to run a modified block schedule this year (Red and Blue Days are back!). Students will have all 7 classes on Monday and then Tuesday-Friday they will have a rotating block. Teachers have taken on each challenge with the new schedule and have a great plan in place to ensure a positive learning environment.

A few advantages of the modified block schedule:

1. Students will worry about fewer classes each day.

2. Less passing times in the hallways.

3. We have accommodated the lunch schedule to ensure social distance while eating.

4. Time to get classwork completed.

9. Grades 6-12 will be using Summit Learning as their platform for their core classes. 10. We have quite a few new classes this year. They include Geometry in Construction, Broadcast & Video Production, Culinary Spanish, Flexibility and Conditioning, Advanced PE/Weights, ACC Statistics, and ACC American Government.

11. We'll be cleaning desks/tables and other high touch surfaces after each class period.

12. WU Tech students do not attend WU Tech every day. Part of their time is remote learning.

NEKLS School Library Covid Relief Grant Offers Announced--Santa Fe Trail School Library Receives Covid Relief Grant Santa Fe Trail High School Library was selected to participate in a Covid Relief grant program and was awarded \$2,000.

Schools were able to apply for up to \$5,000 in grant funds, to be used to offset the purchase of materials and/or technology to help ease the disruption COVID-19 caused in our education system.

In awarding grants, the selection committee prioritized three aspects:

- e-content (databases and ebooks)
- safety (materials for curbside/classroom book delivery, materials quarantine and social distancing)
- traditional library media (print books)

Santa Fe Trail High School Library intends to use the funding to provide ebooks and to provide for alternative seating to promote learning while social distancing.

According to Eric Lynch the school media specialist the additional funds will allow us to provide students additional options for reading material and provide flexible ways to make students comfortable while learning in the library.

The funding agency is Northeast Kansas Library System (NEKLS). Headquartered in Lawrence, NEKLS is a publicly-funded entity that supports 118 member libraries, including 51 schools and school districts, in the 14 counties of Northeast Kansas. Through strengthening member schools and libraries, NEKLS annually improves the education of 140,880 students in grades K-12 across the region.

The Northeast Kansas Library System Staff and Executive Board offered \$80,000 in competitive grants to school libraries that serve any combination of students aged K-12. In all, NEKLS received 47 grant applications from schools or districts. Grant offers were extended to 41 applicants, representing 51 schools in 18 districts.

"We are pleased to be able to help these 51 schools improve physical safety and digital library services to their students and to their faculty and staff. A vibrant library is vital to any school community," said Laura DeBaun, Director of NEKLS.

Each proposal was unique, and NEKLS recognized that each school has unique needs. The program asks that school libraries use funds to the best effect for the learning and safety needs of each particular situation.

Grantees will be required to complete financial and narrative reports to assist NEKLS in evaluating this program.
