has been a huge challenge, but the ladies always greet our kids warmly and help them any way they can! Miss Cheryl (Florance) takes care of lunch accounting and handing out milk and silverware. Mr. Payne and Miss Kathy (Alcorn) watch over the cafeteria, and Miss Jackie (Beatty), Miss Dusty (Rolla), Miss Jen (Molloy) and Mrs. Jennings take turns covering the second space in the commons.


Music – Mrs. Soby - Music class is going great guns this year! We are still playing instruments but using gloves that are washed each time we use them and the kids are really enjoying it!

First Grade – Mrs. Diggens - We learned about bar graphs and pictographs in math recently. We created a fun pictograph to review!


Kindergarten – Ms. Crumpton - In Math, we learned how to work with partners. After making the partner PACT, students buddied up and took turns playing a
