


**Overbrook Attendance Center




Leader in Me Lighthouse Action Committees were busy in October and November planning for activities to support three targets for this year, Leadership: Personal Effectiveness, Culture: School Engagement (School Belonging), and Academics: Goal Focus and Achievement. Leadership Team is continuing to put students into leadership positions with morning announcements and sharing a weekly goal. Their other focus is spotting leadership and personal effectiveness in action with “Spot the Leader.” Culture Team is leading the staff and classes in designing and displaying bulletin boards in the building. K-1 will display in the east hall “trophy case,” and 2-3 will display in the Commons “trophy

case.” Academic Team has led our WIGS – Wildly Important Goals. Teachers started by demonstrating setting a goal for themselves and asking their students for help in tracking it. Next step in the progression is setting class goals, and then finally personal goals. In preparation for so much displaying of our Leader In Me activities, bulletin boards throughout the building have been painted a consistent flat black, allowing for less waste of paper to cover the boards and a clean background.

Very soon a **new album of winter and Christmas stories will be available on the OAC Virtual Library** – all read by OAC faculty and staff! When we realized we could not have our December Family Literacy Night, we still wanted to continue providing a reading activity. Veteran’s Day is an anticipated school-wide activity each year! This year we knew we couldn’t bring our veterans into the building, but also couldn’t forget them! We asked the veterans to come to us by participating in a Veteran Day’s Parade that started at First National Bank and looped by the school. First, our day began with a visit from the Army recruiter, Jesse McElfresh, who spoke to each class group for approximately 15 minutes, sharing his story and answering their questions. Thanks to Mrs. Deines, Miss Koger, and Mrs. Kurtz for creating a beautiful thank you. Thanks to the staff for all the creativity!!! Students, faculty, staff, and some parents lined the street from start to finish waving, smiling and displaying colorful signs they’d made. We were lucky to have one of the veterans coincidentally lead the parade with flags displayed on his truck. A representative band from SFTHS played the National Anthem at the bank, and the parade was led by our school resource officer, Deputy Beattie. Twenty-nine cars and seven walkers participated! **WHAT A GLORIOUS TIME WE HAD!** Veterans had decorated their cars and had flags to wave at us. There were no smiles left unshared!
