We will continue to monitor this new schedule and the effectiveness to meet the needs of our students and families.

Classroom teachers will send out more information about this celebration.

What's happening in the Curriculum Department?

It's assessment season. We have screened all students PK-12 with local and state screeners. These screeners are benchmarks for beginning, middle, and end of the year data to inform teachers and drive their instruction. These assessments, along with daily interactions and formatives, give teachers a detailed picture of each student. Students will be benchmarked again in the winter and spring to determine their growth. The following assessments are used in USD 434 to evaluate student readiness in Math, Literacy, and SEL.

- TLEC Developmental Screener Preschool screener for targeting all areas of child development
- ASQ- Ages and Stages Parent Questionnaire for Preschool and Kindergarten students to assess kindergarten readiness
- Fast Bridge- Criterion referenced assessment for K-5 Math, Literacy, and SEL
- NWEA MAP- Norm referenced assessment for 6-12 Literacy and Math
- State Interim Assessments- Mini tests in reading and math to evaluate proficiency in state standards.
- KAP (Kansas Assessment Program)- State mandated assessments in math, reading, science, and social studies. All students in 3-8th, 10th, and 11th are assessed on their proficiency of grade level standards.
- DLM (Dynamic Learning Map)- This is the alternate state assessment that is used for students with an IEP that have a significant cognitive disability, and receives extensive and individualized instruction within the SPED classroom.

Alongside the assessments, let us not forget all the wonderful instructional efforts that are taking place in the district. We continue down the path of improved literacy with a comprehensive approach, support struggling students with multi-tiered systems of support, integrate project-based learning, provide rigor and depth of knowledge through inquiry-based mathematics, allow for discovery learning with our STREAM

program and play based learning, enroll students at both Washburn Tech and in ACC concurrent courses, provide the opportunity to participate in Summit Learning, support SEL through the Leader In Me, explore career pathways with CTE courses, and continue to thrive in fine arts, practical arts, foreign language, technology, and much more. Students at USD 434 are given so many opportunities to learn and grow as individuals. We have worked hard to redesign our schools and the work will continue as our vision to Inspire and Empower every Charger lights a fire in all of us to keep doing better for kids.

Fall Benchmarks 2021-2022

It is a reality that our test scores across the district can use some improvement. We have fantastic teachers but lack some of the resources, time, support systems, accountabilities, and operations that it takes to make a change. We also need to improve our standards alignment K-12 in all content areas (except ELA). We need a consistent and rigorous curriculum and improvements in our testing culture. We still observe outdated and ineffective instructional practices but should support that with continuous instructional and learning leadership. We are all responsible to improve the teaching and learning at SFT. It is imperative that we set goals, build action plans, delegate roles and responsibilities, provide research based and job embedded training, build frameworks for accountability, expect instructional leadership, share the vision and work, and let go of the things that are not working. We need not be scared of change and trying new things. We must also remember that student and staff SEL and wellness must come first in order for teaching and learning to be effective. There must be a common vision in order to move in the same direction. If all stakeholders can come together, I know we can improve our student achievements very quickly.
