#### **ACCOUNTING**

This year in Accounting I have been redesigning the way I go about my educational practices. I am doing this in two ways: 1) Grading using a Standards Based Grading method. What this means is that instead of students culminating points on all that we do throughout the year, I grade them based on their level of mastery for the standards for Accounting. It allows me to have a better understanding of what students actually know based on the skills within Accounting. And then 2) I am using an alternative flipped method where I recorded lessons of me demonstrating the skills we are working on in class. Then students can go at their own pace within the unit while learning the skills. That gives me the ability to help the students that need more assistance rather than stopping the entire class. I have learned ways to adjust the methods that I am using to do the best pedagogy possible.

We had many younger classmen gain varsity experience this year. The junior varsity finished 5-3 on the season and the freshmen were 1-4.

## **Volleyball**

On October 22<sup>nd</sup> the Chargers traveled to West Franklin for the Sub-State Volleyball Tournament for Class 3A. Santa Fe Trail lost to eventual sub-state winner and 1<sup>st</sup> in state Olathe Heritage. Trail finished 12-23. The junior varsity, consisting mostly of freshman, and competed well. The C team did pick up a couple wins, and also made improvements as the year progressed.

#### **Cross Country**

The Santa Fe Trail Cross Country teams competed at the Sabetha 3A Regional on Saturday, October 23rd. The girls team ran a great race and qualified the whole team for the state tournament. The boys did not have a State qualifier but enjoyed many PR's as the year progressed. The girl's team ran at the Class 3A Cross Country State Championships in Wamego. The runners competed well but did not gain medals. The team finished 10<sup>th</sup>.

# **Scholars Bowl**

The varsity season kicked off on 11/1. The team had great success finishing 1<sup>st</sup> and going 9-0! The varsity continued their dominance the following day at West Franklin, going 7-1 and also winning 1<sup>st</sup> place. A great start for the Chargers.

### Girls Golf

Girls Golf put together an outstanding season. The girls consistently finished in the top three at most tournaments that they were full strength. Braegan Buessing was the regional champ for the second year in a row, and also became a 2-time 3A state medalist, after winning 5<sup>th</sup> at 3A state in Hesston.

# KSHSAA Buffer Week

The KSHSAA Senior High Fall Athletic Buffer Week is Monday, November 8<sup>th</sup> thru Sunday, November 14<sup>th</sup>. There shall be no athletic practice, offseason conditioning, informal basketball shooting, working out on wrestling mats, etc. in **school owned** facilities during the fall athletic buffer week. Athletic activities of this nature may not be held under the supervision of a school staff member in non-school facilities. This means a **moratorium** on all school sponsored athletic activities during this week. Gymnasiums shall not be open to students during the fall athletic buffer week for purposes of shooting baskets, working out with weights, etc. **outside of school hours**. Physical education classes are considered part of the school day. Buffer week does not eliminate football practices for those senior high schools who qualify for football playoffs until such time their footballs season is over.

## **KSHSAA Concussion Video Requirement:**

Santa Fe Trail High School students who are planning to participate in sports/cheer/dance anytime during the 2021-2022 school year are required to attend a free National Federation of High Schools Concussion In Sports on-line course prior to starting practices. Those students who are participating in winter sports will be required to have this process completed prior to the start of practice on Monday, November 15<sup>th</sup>. Those that have not completed this requirement by that time, will not be allowed to practice until they have it completed. This is a requirement by the Kansas State High School Activities Association Executive Board. Anyone can participate in this course and many others offered by NFHS by going to NFHSLearn.com. Once completed, you can either print off your certificate or take a photo of it for proof of completion. Again, this is a requirement for any student who plans to participate in sports/cheer/dance during the 2020-21 school year.
