## FREE DENTAL CLINIC

We will be having a free dental clinic in our district this month on January 18th, 19th, and 20th. The FREE school-based dental program includes Dental Exams, X-rays, Dental cleanings, Dental sealants, Fluoride, and Fillings! This program is optional for anyone without a primary dentist or anyone who has not been seen by a dentist in the last six months for regular routine dental care.
