Please remember to enroll your child for our FREE school-based dental program, including Dental Exams, X-rays, Dental cleanings, Dental sealants, Fluoride and Fillings! This program is optional for anyone without a primary dentist or anyone who has not been seen by a dentist in the last six months for regular routine dental care. We accept enrollment forms all year, but to ensure they receive services at the upcoming clinic, please submit consents by **January 7**, **2022**. Healthy Futures accepts Medicaid, Commercial Insurance, and the uninsured. There is **NO COST** to you even if your child is uninsured or not fully covered through commercial insurance. This program is open to all students, no restrictions.
