


**Overbrook Attendance Center

Congratulations to our **SPOT THE LEADERS** for the month of March! We also celebrated Mrs. Gomez and Mrs. Grienke!


Parent Teacher Conferences were well-attended! Classes continued with Student Led Conferences, showing off their Leadership Notebooks and accomplishments to their parents. During conferences, we asked parents to take our short Leader in Me survey. Every parent who did (143), their student was entered in a drawing for prizes. At our next assembly, Miss Crumpton and Mrs. Bolt gave away almost 20 prizes! Thank you to PTO for our pizza meal!



Leader in Me is an embedded part of our daily lives at OAC. We work to give our students voice and choice, and help them to practice the 7 Habits. As we have grown, we continue to add best practices for continued growth. This spring semester has been an exceptional one for growth: student led conferences with Leadership Notebooks, setting individual, class, and schoolwide WIGs, Voices of the Week for announcements, and the Student Lighthouse planning for activities and leadership opportunities.

The entire school is participating in setting *WIGs – Wildly Important Goals* – another focus in Leader in Me. Students and teachers have individual WIGs, and there are two schoolwide WIGs we are currently



tracking. We've noticed the students are especially proud of their class's reading WIG – raising the number of reading levels achieved. The baseline was established March 8 at 602 levels raised for the year. Teachers are rewarding classroom improvements, which are determined entirely through progress monitoring of reading skills. The students are well on their way to achieving this goal. The schoolwide goal was last updated on April 4. We are well on the way to hitting this goal!! BIG SURPRISE for the students when we reach the reading goal – and we are almost there!

The Lunchroom WIG was developed to teach manners and responsibility in the lunchroom. A calendar is marked accordingly each day by the lunchroom adult monitors. When a class has achieved 10 good days, they have earned a reward according to the number of times they achieved the WIG. We kicked off this WIG with a morning Dance Party (just 3 minutes) that the kids loved!!

1. Get a surprise note delivered to your homeroom by a surprise visitor. Bragging about your lunchroom behavior in the note!
2. Receive a shout out from the Voice of the Week during morning announcements.
3. Get your class photo placed by the shout out wall with a label bragging about your lunchroom behavior.
4. Extra Center Time
5. Play a Board Game or Game
6. Play a Fun Review Game Wear a Hat Day
7. No Shoe Day (in the classroom only!)



As you can see – Many classrooms have earned their third reward, earning a picture on the Shout Out Wall!

On March 10, we participated in the **State-wide Tornado Drill**. The students did very well, following their teachers' directions, moving to their assigned safety area, and remaining quiet until the all-clear, all under five minutes!
