Football

The 2022 Charger Football Team consists of 46 players this year. Our Jamboree was at Silver Lake, where JV and V levels scrimmaged against Royal Valley and Holton. The varsity traveled to Burlington on September 2rd for their first game of the season, losing 12-32. The JV team defeated Burlington 20-14 Tuesday 9/6. On September 9th, the varsity team's home opener is vs. Prairie View to face the Buffaloes.

Volleyball

Santa Fe Trail Varsity and JV started the season 9/1 with 2 matches versus Osage City. The varsity played in a tournament on Saturday, September 4th at Jefferson West, finishing 2-3 on the day. Their overall record is 4-3. The Varsity and JV squad will have a home opener 9/8 vs St. Marys. There are 19 volleyball players on the roster for 2022, which will allow for 2 levels of play.

Girls Golf

The Girl's Golf Team has participated in 2 golf tournaments so far this season, and one canceled because of rain. The Chargers have had a top 6 medalist in each tournament. There are 5 girls participating. SFT is the host of the next golf meet at Lamont Hill on 9/13.

Cross Country

The Santa Fe Trail HS Cross Country roster consists of 13 girls and 10 boys this year. The team's first competition was at Anderson County on 9/2, where the boys finished in 1st place! The team races at Melvern Lake on 9/8. The team will get a feel for the state meet course on 9/24 when it travels to Rim Rock.

Dance Team and Cheerleading

The dance team has 11 members for the 2022-2023 school year. They provide entertainment at pep rallies, at the halftime of home games, and also compete in dance competitions during the school year.

SFTHS has 20 cheerleaders for the 2022-2023 school year. The cheerleaders are excited for the home opener and look forward to promoting spirit at our football games.
