Leads on Learning


At this month's Advanced Literacy Leadership Cadre, we discussed learning strategies to improve student learning. These strategies are a type of retrieval practice that helps students recall information that they are learning. One of the best ways to use retrieval practice in the classroom can also be used at home; flashcards. Here are a few tips for using flashcards correctly:

- Once a flashcard has been mastered, keep in the deck for a while. A fact needs to be successfully retrieved three times before moving on.
- Shuffle the flashcards to ensure that correct answers aren't just predicted.
- Timing. Once the student gives an answer, regardless if it is correct, give them time to retrieve the information before seeing the correct answer.
- Say the answer out loud.


Choir Announcements

Nursing/Health Office

Temperatures are fluctuating and with that we are seeing more headaches, sore throats and even stomachaches. Please keep in mind that it is not only allergy season but we will be starting to see influenza and stomach flu make their appearances soon. Preventative measures include good handwashing, not sharing drinks, covering mouths/noses when cough, and following the recommended guidelines (see picture) when it comes to keeping kids home and sending them back after illnesses.

One way to help the nurse with the increase in visits to the nursing/health office is to make sure you have a current Over the Counter medication administration form on file. These need to be completed and submitted every school year in order for your child to received any medication, including cough drops, from the nurse. If you send in a signed Over the Counter medication form, please send the medication, in the original bottle, with your child. We can store it in the nurse's office for the school year. There is a very limited supply of over the counter medication that the nurse has available and it is for Emergency Use Only!
