# Leads on Learning

This month's literacy strategy involves partner reading and is called paragraph shrinking. This a great way to improve a student's oral reading fluency and summarization skills in only 20 minutes. Here's how it works:

- Find a grade level short story or passage. www.readworks.org is a free resource for passages.
- Partner A (parent or higher reader) begins by reading aloud for 5 minutes while Partner B follows along.
- Partner B rereads the same text for 5 minutes, while
   Partner A follows along, assisting by prompting only if necessary.
- For the next 5 minutes, Partner A starts where Partner B left off, stopping after every paragraph to summarize.
- For the final 5 minutes, Partner B will read from where Partner A left off, stopping after each paragraph to summarize.
- \*\*\* The key to the summarization after each paragraph is that the partner can only use ten words or less.

The focus of this month is empathy, or simply put, being able to put yourself in someone else's shoes.

Some surveys indicate that empathy is

Some surveys indicate that empathy is on the decline in the United States and elsewhere, findings that motivate parents, schools, and communities to support programs that help people of all ages enhance and maintain their ability to be empathetic. Researchers believe people can choose to cultivate and prioritize empathy. People who spend more time with individuals different from themselves tend to adopt a more empathic outlook toward others. Other research finds that reading novels can help foster the ability to put ourselves in the minds of others. Meditation has also been shown to help cultivate brain states that increase empathy. How do we improve empathy in our students? There are four ways: model empathy, discuss emotions, help out in the home and community, and praise empathetic behavior.

# Nursing/Health Office

Temperatures are fluctuating and with that we are seeing more headaches, sore throats and even stomachaches. Please keep in mind that it is not only allergy season but we will be starting to see influenza and stomach flu make their appearances soon. Preventative measures include good handwashing, not sharing drinks, covering mouths/noses when cough, and following the recommended guidelines (see picture) when it comes to keeping kids home and sending them back after illnesses.

One way to help the nurse with the increase in visits to the nursing/health office is to make sure you have a current Over the Counter medication administration form on file. These need to be completed and submitted every school year in order for your child to received any medication, including cough drops, from the nurse. If you send in a signed Over the Counter medication form, please send the medication, in the original bottle, with your child. We can store it in the nurse's office for the school year. There is a very limited supply of over the counter medication that the nurse has available and it is for Emergency Use Only!
