#### MATH AT SFT

Algebra class conducting their height vs. wingspan project. Students collected their heights and wingspans and graphed the results. The class was able to graph a line of best fit and write an equation for the line to make predictions.

#### **HEALTH CLASS**

Students in the Health class have been talking about the significant influence digital media has on their health and wellness. Students were checking their time on specific apps so far during the week. They then kept a log for 24 hours documenting the amount of time spent on specific apps, movies, or games. We will then evaluate our data and develop skills to reduce the amount of time spent on digital media platforms.

## THEATER MASKS

The students in Technical Theatre are learning about different cultures from all periods in time and how they use/used theatrical masks. Students have chosen their culture and theatre mask and are now in the beginning process of mask creation. Students are using clay and recycled materials to build masks. Students will put together a presentation about the culture of their choosing and deliver the presentation at the same time the present their masks.

# Sports Literature Wraps Up

Sports Literature classes began preparations this week for their final. Students will be participating in a debate following the model of the ESPN show *Around the Horn*. Students watched an episode of the show to understand the format of the final, then selected topics for the "segment" of the debate they wanted to participate in, and are now forming their opinions and conducting their research to prepare for their topic. The day of the debate, questions will be posed by student moderators. The project is the culmination of practice forming opinions, finding and citing evidence to support opinions, and learning how to form rebuttals to counter arguments throughout the semester.

- 13. Asphalt—Finish the back parking lot.
