Athletics and Activities at Santa Fe Trail High School

The winter sports season is approaching post season! The spring sports season is just around the corner with practices starting on Monday, February 27th. Student athletes must have their physical, district activity form, concussion form, and COVID-19 form completed and turned in, if they have not done so. They must also have completed an on-line concussion education program (more information below). There will be a High School Spring Sports Parent Meeting on Wednesday, February 15th at 7:00 pm in the high school gym.

Basketball

The Santa Fe Trail boys and girls basketball teams are competing well this season. Currently, the Varsity boys are 4-9. The Varsity girls are 11-2 on the season. Winter Royalty is on Friday, February 3rd and the ceremonies will be at halftime of the boys' varsity game against Prairie View. Senior night will be held on Friday, February 17th when we host Wellsville. SFTHS will play in the basketball sub-state held at Anderson County High School the week of February 27th. Since we are 3A for basketball, the first round games will be held at the higher seeded team's home site. The sub-state winners will advance to state to be held at Hutchinson Community College-Sports Arena in Hutchinson the following week.

Wrestling

The SFT wrestlers are winding down their season as they only have Pioneer League left for regular season on Thursday the 2nd at 4:30pm for the girls at Osawatomie, and Thursday, February 9th for the boys at Wellsville. Santa Fe Trail girls will travel to Rossville on February 11th, and the boys travel to Baldwin High School for Regional Wrestling on February 18th. Those wrestlers who place 1st, 2nd, 3rd or 4th at Regionals will then go on to state competition at the Tony's Pizza Event Center in Salina on February 22rd and 23rd for girls, and 24th and 25th for boys. SFT is still in Class 4A for Wrestling.

The SFT Girls have taken 1st at Council Grove, 1st at Wellsville, and 2nd at Baldwin out of 23 teams, and are 6-4 in duels. The boys have won the Anderson County Invitiational, 2nd at Rossville, and 4th at Baldwin, and are also 6-4 in duels.

Concussion Program

Santa Fe Trail High School students who are planning to participate in sports/cheer/dance anytime during the 2022-2023 school year are required to attend a free Concussion In Sports on-line course prior to starting practices. Those students who are participating in spring sports will be required to have this process completed prior to the start of practice on Monday, February 27th. Those that have not completed this requirement by that time, will not be allowed to practice until they have it completed. This is a requirement by the Kansas State High School Activities Association Executive Board. Anyone can participate in these courses and many others offered by NFHS by going to NFHSLearn.com. Once completed, you can either print off your certificate or take a photo of it for proof of completion. Again, this is a requirement for any student who plans to participate in sports/cheer/dance during the 2022-2023 school year.
