HIGH SCHOOL PROM



Classroom updates

Here are a couple highlights of the happenings in World History, 80's & 90's, Crime and Criminals/First Responders classes.

World History- The sophomores are working on their "legacy project." This project consists of the students finding an interesting topic to present to the youth in our district within the general theme of 'Absolute Rulers.' Younger students throughout the district admire and respect our high schoolers and are interested in learning from them. Sophomores in world history are being asked to create an 8-12 minute video complete with a background of themselves, 4 key components or their topic, and an interactive activity that our young people will be able to do at home on their own time. These videos will be shared on the school website for our youth to learn about interesting world history topics as well as being able to enjoy some activities at home on their own time.

80's-90's- Students are learning about life and history in the 80's and 90's and being asked to interact with those who lived through those transformative decades of history. Currently, students are getting ready to learn about the OKC Bombing in 1995 that shook the nation. Students will learn about the many Kansas connections to the bombing and will get the

opportunity to visit the museum in OKC. Truly being a part of history, the students will visit the museum archives to see actual artifacts used to convict Tim McVeigh, take a tour of the grounds, and see how forensic evidence would be used to piece together the events of the bombing.

Crimes/Criminals/First Responders- Students are learning about some of the infamous crimes and criminals in modern history including, Bundy, Green River Killer, and Dahmer as well as infamous crimes that occurred in Kansas such as BTK, and Kraig Kahler. Besides learning about the crimes perpetrated, students have also heard or will hear from various professionals and career opportunities such as medical examiners, correction officers, and law enforcement officials. Students have also had the opportunity to get tested in CPR and First Aid thanks to Ms. Chiddix to allow them to be prepared to act in cases of emergency.

Athletics and Activities at Santa Fe Trail High School

<u>Baseball</u>

The baseball team has gotten off to a perfect start sitting at 4-0. The JV is also sporting a 4-0 record. The JV typically plays on Monday nights, and the Varsity on Tuesday nights. The team has 26 players. Regionals this year will be hosted by West Franklin, however the number 1 and 2 seed will host the first two rounds of the 8-team bracket on 5/15, with West Franklin hosting the final game on 5/17. Garnett-Anderson County HS, LaCygne-Prairie View HS, Olathe-Heritage Christian Academy, Osage City HS, Osawatomie HS, Pomona-

West Franklin HS, Santa Fe Trail HS, and Wellsville HS are the teams in the regional. The state tournament will be held at Kansas State University, on May 25-26.

Softball

The softball team has 21 players participating. The varsity is currently 3-2, while the JV is 1-5. Both JV and Varsity teams typically play double headers on Tuesday nights. The 8-team regional host is Prairie View. Prairie View will host the quarter finals on Monday, May 15, followed by the semi and finals on Tuesday, May 16. Kansas City-Bishop Ward HS, LaCygne-Prairie View HS, Osawatomie HS, Perry-Lecompton HS, Pomona-West Franklin HS, Santa Fe Trail HS, and Wellsville HS are the teams in the Region. The state tournament will be held in Manhattan at the Twin Oakes Complex on May 25-26.

Boys Golf

The boys golf team couldn't have started much better as the varsity took second at the West Lyon County Invitational at Emporia, and for the third year in a row won the Burlington Invitational at Rock Creek CC. There are 17 boys out for golf this year. Osage City will host the regional on May 15th, with Garnett-Anderson County HS; LaCygne-Prairie View HS; Olathe-Heritage Christian Academy; Osage City HS; Osawatomie HS; Perry-Lecompton HS; Pomona-West Franklin HS; and Wellsville HS all competing for a trip to Dodge City for the 3A state championship, on May 22-23rd.

Track & Field

The Santa Fe Trail track team broke a school record at their very first meet of the season on April 1st, in Silver Lake. Both the varsity and JV competed. Whitney Herren broke the shot putt record. The track team has 26 boys and 27 girls participating. Regionals will be at West Franklin, with the following teams competing: Atchison-Maur Hill-Mount Academy, Effingham-Atchison Co Community HS, Hiawatha HS, Hoyt-Royal Valley HS, Kansas City-Bishop Ward HS, Marysville HS, Meriden-Jefferson West HS, Olathe-Heritage Christian Academy, Perry-Lecompton HS, Pomona-West Franklin HS, Rossville HS, Sabetha HS, Seneca-Nemaha Central HS, Silver Lake HS, and Wellsville HS. The top four in each event will qualify for the 3A state championship in Wichita, on May 26-27th.
