A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Charger Families,

Students have been working diligently on their Fastbridge assessments in our building. These assessments help our teachers guide their instruction throughout the year, help identify students in need of extra support and allows our staff to work with the students on setting Wildly Important Goals (WIGS). This quarter we are celebrating our student's success with different tiers of rewards.



- 5pt increase = small candy
- 10pt increase = extra recess
- 20pt increase = treasure box
- College & Career Ready = popsicle party

K-1 Students take the earlyReading and earlyMath assessment:

The earlyReading is a universal screening tool designed to assess reading/math foundational skills associated with kindergarten and first grade. It provides domain specific assessments of these component skills in reading (Concepts of Print, Phonemic Awareness, Phonics, and Fluency), as well as a general estimate of overall reading achievement (composite). The earlyMath focuses on three domains of number sense: number, relations, and operations, as well as a general estimate of overall math achievements (composite).

2-3 Students take the aReading and aMath assessment:

aReading and aMath is a computer adaptive measure of broad reading/math skills that is individualized for each student. The type of questions and response format is substantially similar to many state-wide assessments (i.e., multiple choice, fill in the blank). Both auditory and visual stimuli are presented for each question.

2-3 Students take the CBMReading assessment

This is a brief universal screening measure to assess and monitor reading fluency and accuracy. The student reads aloud for one-minute on three separate grade-level reading passages. The CBMreading assessment is a highly reliable indicator of overall reading health.

COUNSELOR'S CORNER


