Technology Classes

4th & 5th grade

The students in 4th and 5th grade tech class will continue to focus on learning proper keyboarding skills.

The students are working on "design" by designing a winter scene using one google slide and only using shapes and line drawing tool. I encourage the students to be creative, innovative and have lots of detail in their overall winter scene. They will learn new skills such as Ctrl+D for duplicating their shapes, mirroring a shape, ordering the shapes by sending some to the front and some to the back and grouping shapes that will be easier to move around as one whole shape. They will then learn how to save the slide as an image file (jpg).

6th Grade Tech

6th grade is learning about what it means to be a digital citizen and all the do's and don'ts that comes with living in the digital world. Students continue to practice their typing skills twice a week along with activities about the 6 topics of digital citizenship.

Students learned real life situations through banzai.org digital citizenship simulation program and they will finish their 9 week class by creating an animation using animaker.com about a specific digital citizenship topic.
