**A message from our principal**

Dear Charger Families,

Our 3rd-grade students will participate in the Kansas State Assessments for English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics, while our 2nd-grade students will take part in a smaller-scale pilot state

assessment. These assessments serve several important purposes, including:

- Measuring key indicators within the Kansas College and Career Ready Standards (KCCRS).
- Providing data for Annual Measurable Objectives (AMOs) and state accreditation.
- Reporting individual student scores along with performance levels.
- Offering insights to help improve ELA and mathematics instruction at the school and district level.

Students will take these assessments online using Chromebooks.

Below is the tentative testing schedule. We kindly ask that you ensure your child is present on these days and avoid scheduling appointments to prevent unnecessary absences.



### Testing Schedule for 3rd Grade

- ✦ **Mathematics** – April 8th & April 9th (Morning)
- ✦ **English Language Arts** – April 15th & April 16th (Morning)

### Testing Schedule for 2nd Grade

- ✦ **Mathematics** – April 4th (Morning)
- ✦ **English Language Arts** – April 3rd (Morning)

We encourage our students to:

- ✓ **Stay quiet & seated** (during and after testing)
- ✓ **Take their time & use test-taking strategies**
- ✓ **Engage actively** (read questions carefully, take notes, use provided tools)
- ✓ **Quietly participate in an activity** once finished
- ✓ **Raise their hand** for teacher review before submitting

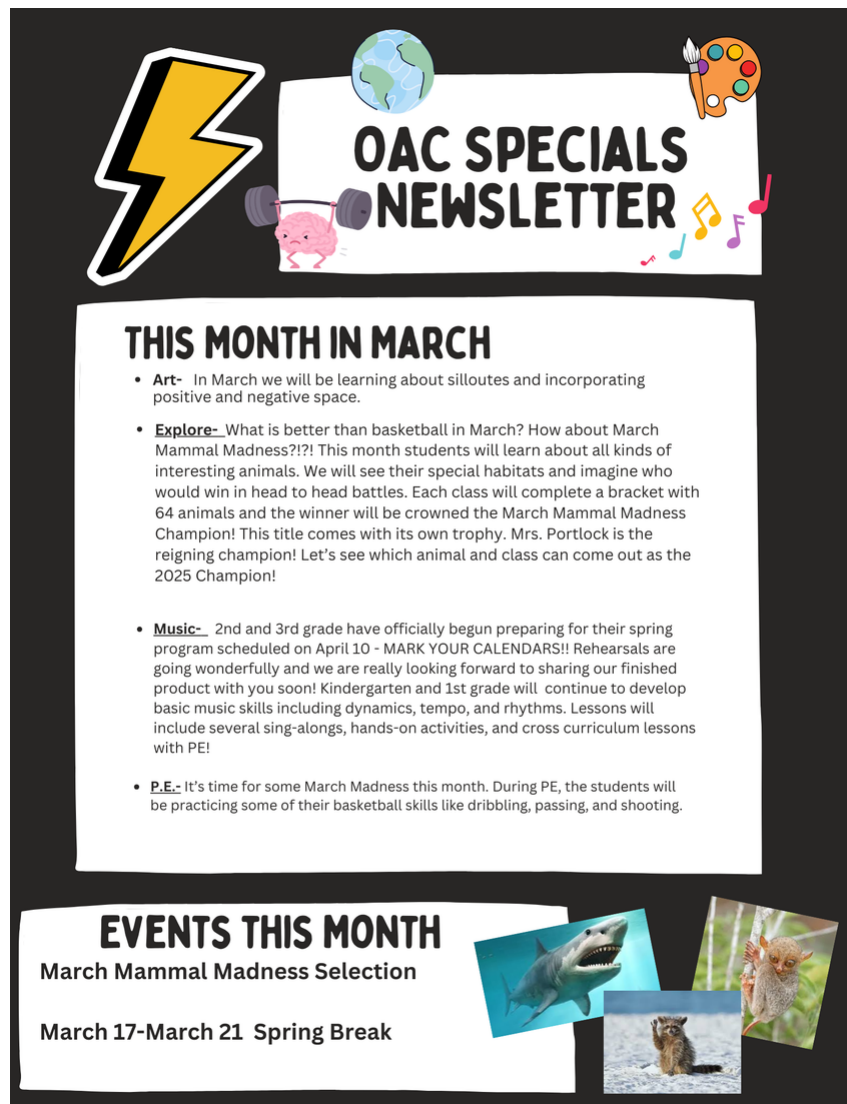

### Board Goal 3: Recruit and Retain Highly Qualified Staff

I am pleased to share our ongoing efforts to recruit and retain highly qualified staff at Overbrook Attendance Center (OAC). Below are key initiatives supporting this goal:

1. **Recruitment Efforts** – This fall, we attended the Kansas State University Education Round-Up to actively recruit educators to join our district.
2. **University Partnerships** – OAC has partnered with Baker University to place four college students in our classrooms, allowing them to complete their block coursework and gain firsthand experience in education. Our goal is to have them return as student teachers in the future.
3. **Mentor Program Growth** – We continue to expand our highly qualified mentor program, with three dedicated mentors at OAC. These mentors receive ongoing professional development to enhance their coaching and mentoring techniques.
4. **Professional Development & Advanced Degrees** – Our recent LETRS training for the 2025-2026 school year has inspired two teachers to apply for the Bovay Grant to pursue their Master's degrees in Reading Specialist programs.
5. **Culture & Climate Enhancement** – Through our Building Leadership Team (BLT), we actively engage in a feedback loop to address staff concerns and ensure accountability, fairness, and equitable practices.

6. **Staff Recognition & Peer Learning** – The "Charger of the Month" initiative continues to recognize outstanding staff contributions. We are also working to expand opportunities for meaningful peer observations, as we believe learning from one another strengthens our instructional practices.
