2025-2026 Preschool Enrollment

It's that time of year to collect information from parents about your interest in preschool next year. Preschool operations work separately from K-12 education due to funding, special education requirements, and student placement consideration. Soon, a Google link will be shared via Seesaw for you to fill out regarding preschool for next year.

Filling out this form does NOT complete the enrollment process or guarantee a spot in the preschool. This gives us basic information to begin planning for the next school year. There will be an online or in-person Preschool Enrollment opportunity in the summer that is mandatory for all students.
