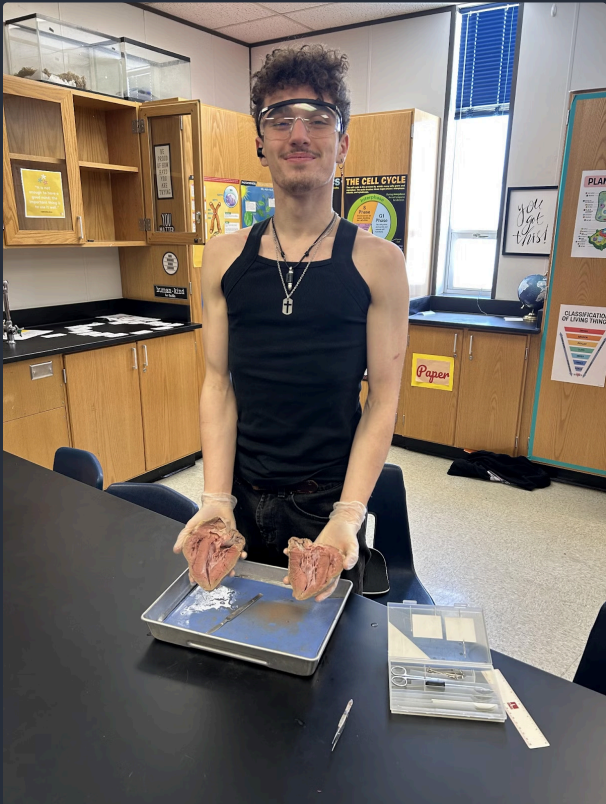
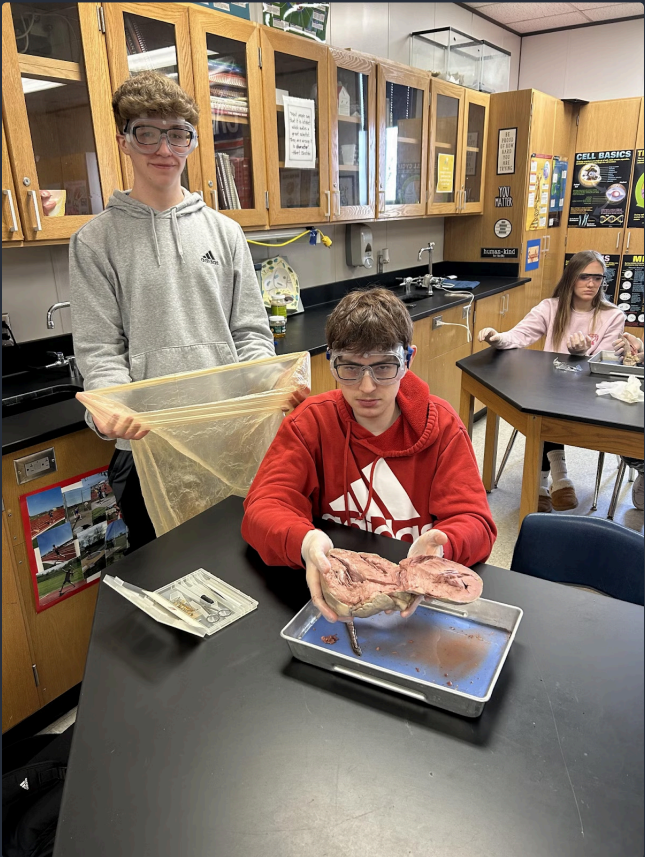
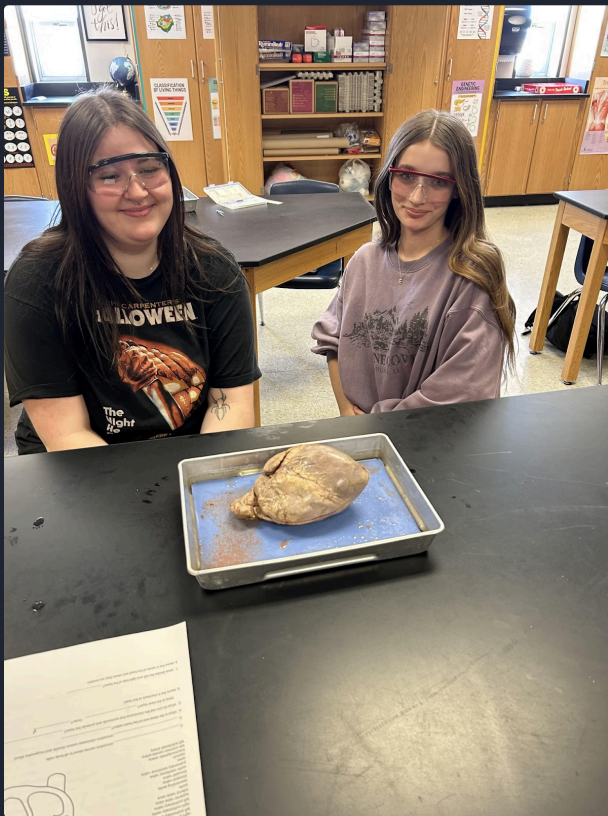
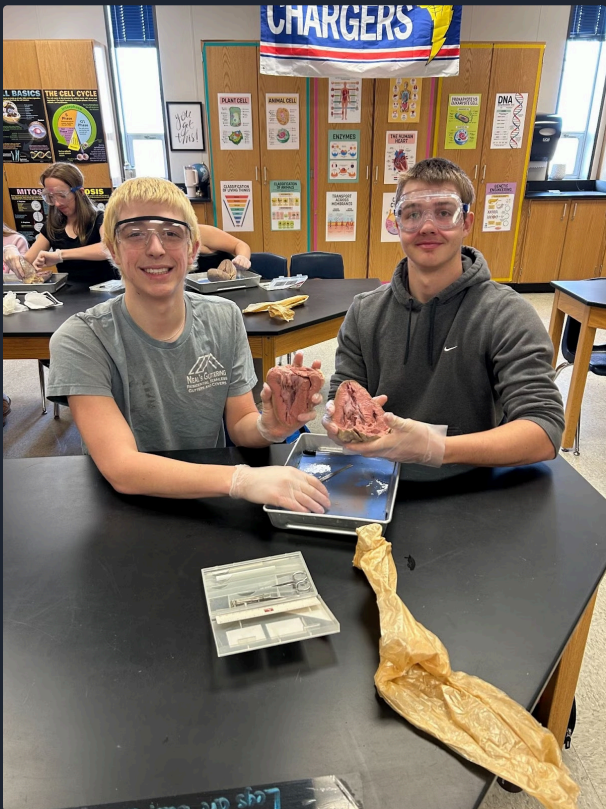
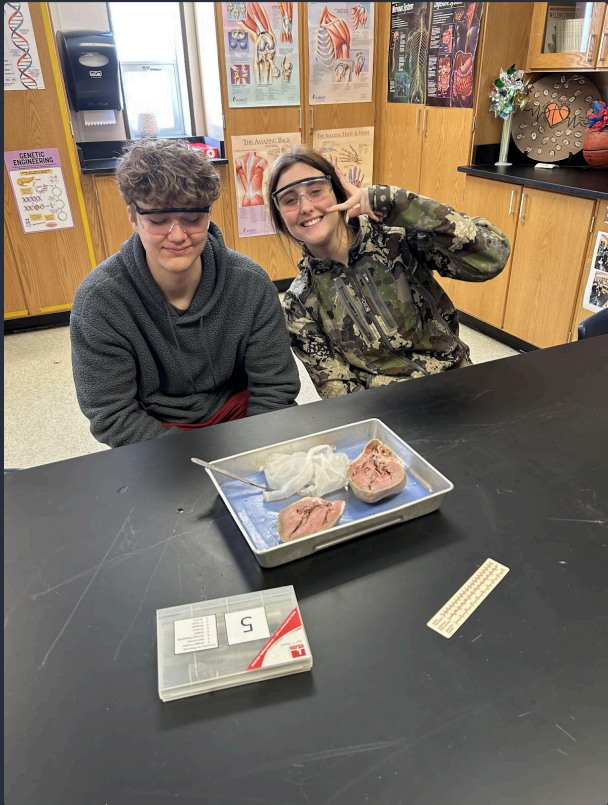
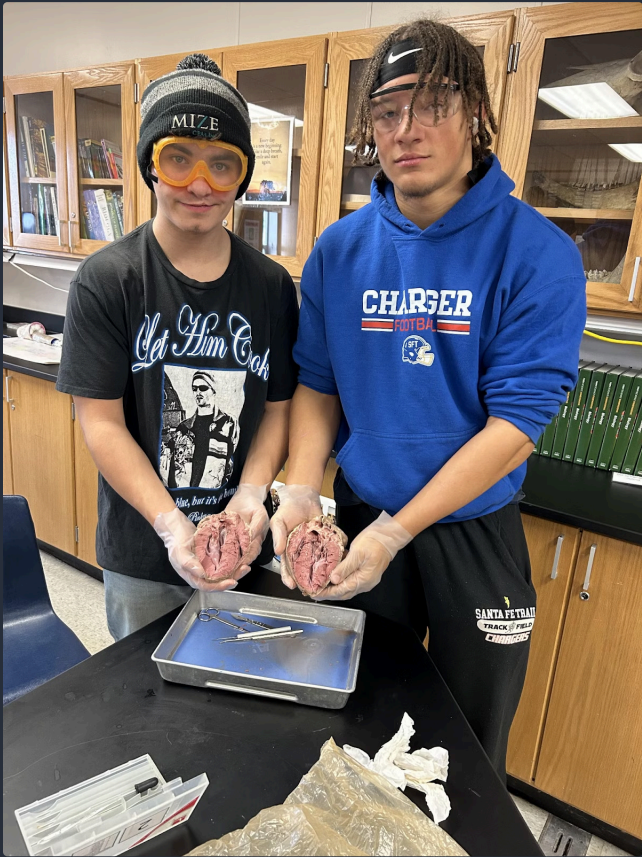
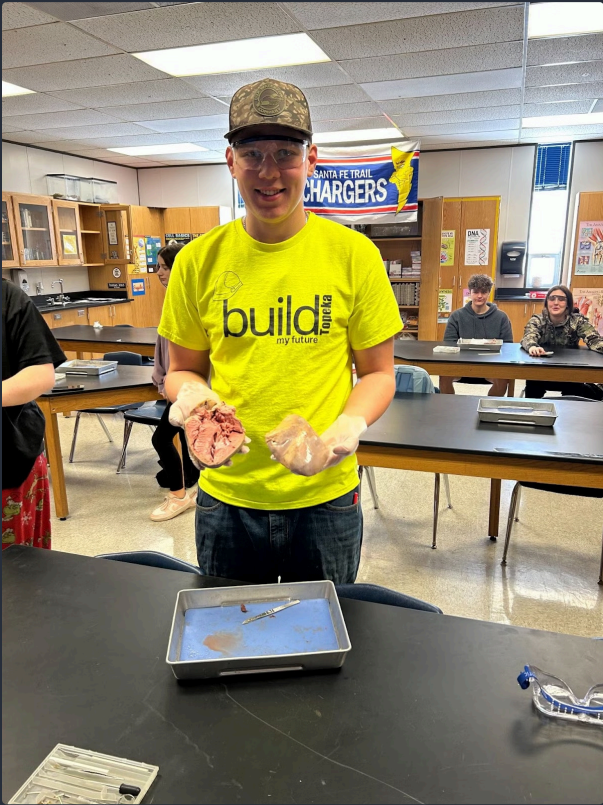


Classroom Highlights

The Mission of Santa Fe Trail USD 434 is to nurture the students' self-esteem and thirst for knowledge. Students will graduate with a defined body of knowledge, the ability to comprehend and apply reasoning, as well as behavioral skills necessary to compete effectively and efficiently in the world, both now and in the future.

Santa Fe Trail Budget Reductions

Santa Fe Trail USD 434 must reduce its planned budget for the 2003 – 2004 school year. Areas where expenditures must be reduced or eliminated are identified months ahead of the actual budget development in order to follow contractual responsibilities with the professional staff. Budget reductions are caused by two issues: 1) declining enrollment and 2) reduced State of Kansas financial support. Both are equally important.

Santa Fe Trail schools lost enrollment in all attendance centers for the current school year except at the Overbrook school. The district must make-up for the drop of 40 students that occurred primarily at Santa Fe Trail High School and the Carbondale Attendance Center. The total number of dollars that must be reduced is \$252,500. The Board of Education has determined that cuts will be made in the areas of 1) non-personnel expenditures - \$25,000; 2) extra-curricular programming such as activities and sports - \$50,000 and 3) certified and non-certified personnel positions, \$182,500. These planned and projected cuts are on top of the \$80,000 in budget cuts made in the current budget year.

Since 87% of the district's budget is dedicated to personnel costs, it is apparent that reductions must affect personnel. Attrition will be used to manage most of the personnel costs. The school district likes to keep its elementary classes small at an average of 16 to 20 students each. Some classes in the district have shrunk to not more than 11 or 12 students in selected areas. At the middle level and high school level, class sizes are targeted for 17 to 25 students on the average. In some cases, classroom numbers have dropped to as low as 8 to 10 students. The school district can no longer afford to have pupil-teacher ratios fall to the low numbers now seen.

As a result of the reduction in student numbers, the school district could easily face the loss of four professional positions in 2003 – 04 and as many as three paraprofessional positions. Along with the teaching and teaching support areas under scrutiny, comes the need to reduce the number of activity sponsors, coaches and related programming costs. The district has utilized a study committee in the current school year to examine and recommend any areas where budget savings can be found. It appears the board of education will not need to eliminate any student activity programs, but the number of staff hired as sponsors in extra-curricular programming will be lessened.

When all projected budget reductions are finally approved, Santa Fe Trail USD 434 will continue its educational programming and will continue to offer a comprehensive student activities program. An opportunity for the public to make comment on all budget cuts is scheduled for Monday, February 24th at 7 pm in the library at Santa Fe Trail High School.

Five Years Since 9/11

Five years... Seems like a long time in terms of life, but looking back on the fateful day of September 11, 2001, it still seems so close.

Let's recap. 8:46 AM- Flight 11 crashes into the North tower of the World Trade Center. 9:03 AM- Flight crashes into the South tower of the World Trade Centers. Within the next thirty minutes, all US airports are put on hold, and all airports around the area of New York City were closed. 9:38 AM- Plane crashes into the Pentagon, and 7 minutes later the White House was evacuated. 10:05 AM- The South WTC tower collapses. Five min. later, the fourth plane crashes in Somerset County, PA. 10:28 AM- The North WTC tower collapses. The rest of the day was full of tears, fear and many more evacuations. With all of the destruction in the nation, there

lies still had to find that their loved one wasn't coming home. From the planes, towers, and pentagon, there were 3,056 casualties. These fatalities were from over 90 countries around the world. Those directly responsible for all of this destruction can never face the consequences, but even worse, can never provide us with answers to our question. Why? That is a common thought to all Americans when we honor that day. Although we all have our own ideas, like an American government conspiracy or a terrorist attack, we still must honor the fallen and respect all of the lives lost.

When you think back on Sept. 11, 2001, remember those in the towers, on the planes, in the pentagon and those who rushed in while others were running out. Even with all of our separate views, we haven't and never will forget what happened on that day.

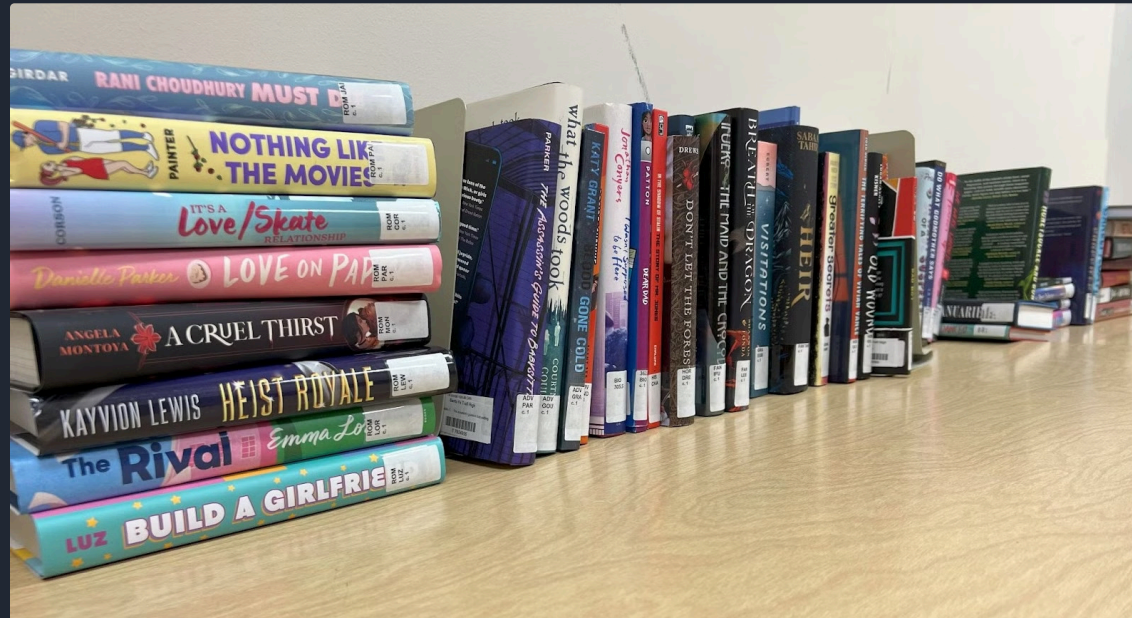
