

In addition, *Tanner Bolt* qualified for nationals with a strong 4th place finish in Cyber Security.


Several other students earned Top 10 finishes, taking the stage during the awards ceremony:

- Morgan Starr 7th place in Organizational Leadership




### **Pennies for Patients**
